

Consent to Participate in Research

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Title of Research Study: Design Opportunities for Mental Health Technologies for Youth

Key Information about this research study:

The following is a short summary of this study to help you decide whether to be a part of this study.

- The purpose of this study is to understand the tensions and challenges in implementing mental health services in community-based organizations that serve youth.
- You will be asked to participate in one session that involves an interview.
- We will ask you questions that touch on your working relationship with the [REDACTED] – we will not quote your remarks in any study reports and will not use your name or other identifying information in any reports about this study.
- The main benefit is that the information you provide within the session will help us design and incorporate a smartphone application for adolescents that aids them in the management of stress in community organizations.
- This session, along with the consent form, will be in English. This is a requirement of the study.

Why am I being asked to take part in this research study?

We are asking you to take part in this research study because you are a staff member affiliated with Rush University and work on the project with the [REDACTED] to integrate mental health care into their organization.

How many people will be in this study?

We expect about 10 participants affiliated with Rush University will be in this research study.

What should I know about participating in a research study?

- Someone will explain the research study to you.
- Whether or not you take part is up to you.
- You can choose not to take part.
- You can agree to take part and later change your mind.
- Your decision will not be held against you.
- You can ask all the questions you want before you decide.

What happens if I say, “Yes, I want to be in this research”?

You will be asked to participate in a 60-minute telephone interview at a date and time that fit your schedule. We will audio record the phone interview – audio-recording is required for participation in this study. You will be asked about your role in the [REDACTED] partnership and about the tensions and barriers you have experienced while working with the [REDACTED] y. You do not have to answer any questions you don't want to answer.

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Will being in this study help me in any way?

We cannot promise that there will be benefits to you or others from your taking part in this research. However, possible benefits include gaining a better understanding of tensions and challenges experienced in implementing mental health services into community-based organizations who serve youth. This study is a step in a potential set of studies in which a technology-enabled program for helping adolescents manage stress and anxiety could be developed. Development of such a program has the potential to improve adolescent mental health.

What happens if I do not want to be in this research?

Participation in research is voluntary. You can decide to participate or not to participate. Your decision about whether to participate in this study is not shared with anyone outside the research team, including Rush University and the [REDACTED].

What happens if I say “Yes”, but I change my mind later?

You can leave the study at any time and it will not be held against you. We can end the interview session at any time. Just let me know if you would like to do this. If this happens, I will ask you if any data collected from up until that point may be used in the research.

What happens to the information collected for the research?

Efforts will be made to limit the use and disclosure of your personal information, including research study records, to people who have a need to review this information. We cannot promise complete secrecy. Organizations that may inspect and copy your information include the IRB and other representatives of this institution. You will be identified only by a unique subject number. Your contact details will be stored separately from your session data. All information will be kept on a password protected computer only accessible by the research team. Information about your participation and your data will not be shared with Rush University or the [REDACTED]. While summary results may be provided to Rush University and [REDACTED] leadership, these will be in aggregate and anonymized. Similarly, the results of the research study may be published, but your name will not be used, and all results will be presented in aggregate without any personal identifiers.

Data Sharing: De-identified data from this study may be shared with the research community at large to advance science and health. We will remove any personal information that could identify you before files are shared with other researchers to ensure that, by current scientific standards and known methods, no one will be able to identify you from the information we share. Despite these measures, we cannot guarantee anonymity of your personal data.

Here is some other information that is useful for you to know

If you agree to take part in this research study, we will pay you \$20 via Hyperwallet. You will still receive this compensation even if you choose to end the interview early. Hyperwallet is a website that delivers virtual payments that can be used for online purchases or can be transferred to your personal bank account. If you choose to transfer the funds to your bank account, you will be required to provide your name, address, and email address. This information will remain confidential and de-identified, and you will not receive spam from Hyperwallet. Additionally, there is a \$1.50 bank (wire) fee that is deducted from the card for bank transfers; we will pay this fee by loading \$21.50 on the card for those participants who choose to transfer the funds to their personal bank account.

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Who can I talk to?

If you have questions, concerns, or complaints, or think the research has affected you in some way, talk to [REDACTED]
