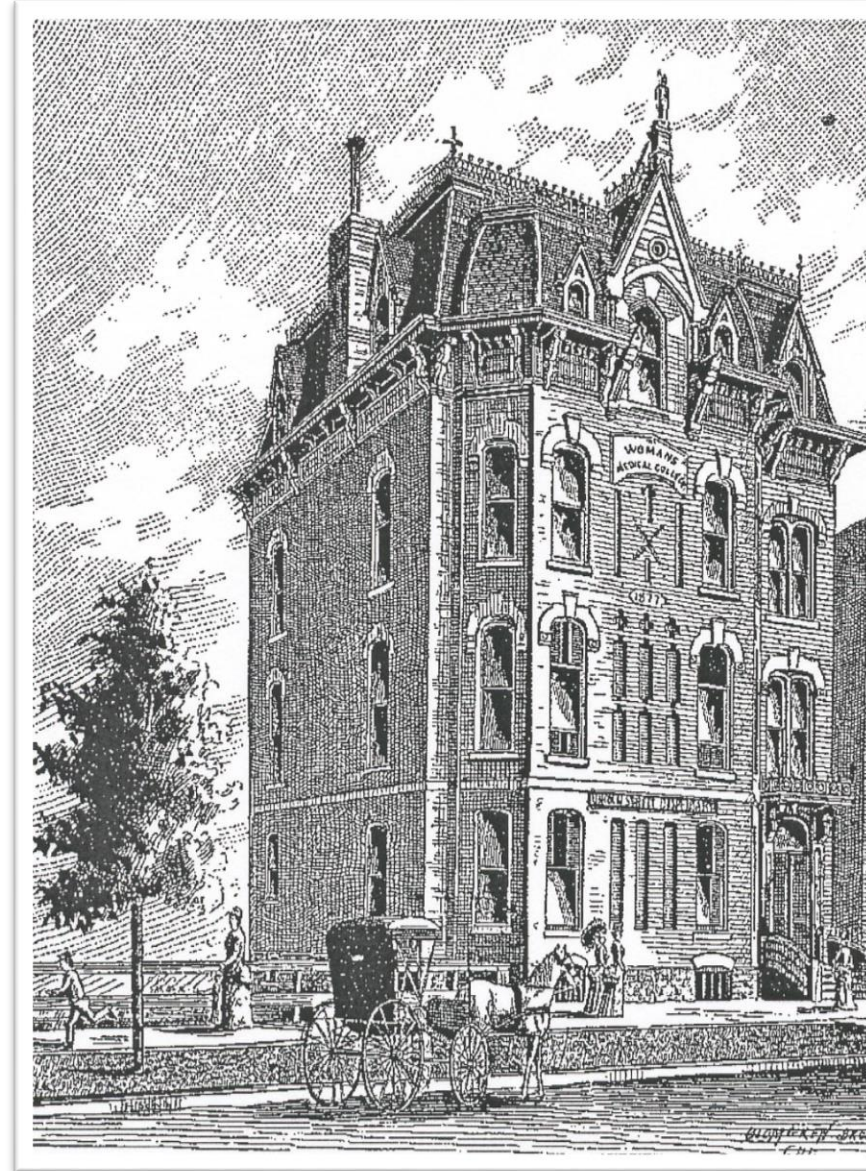


Woman's Hospital Medical College,

Paulina & Adams Sts.



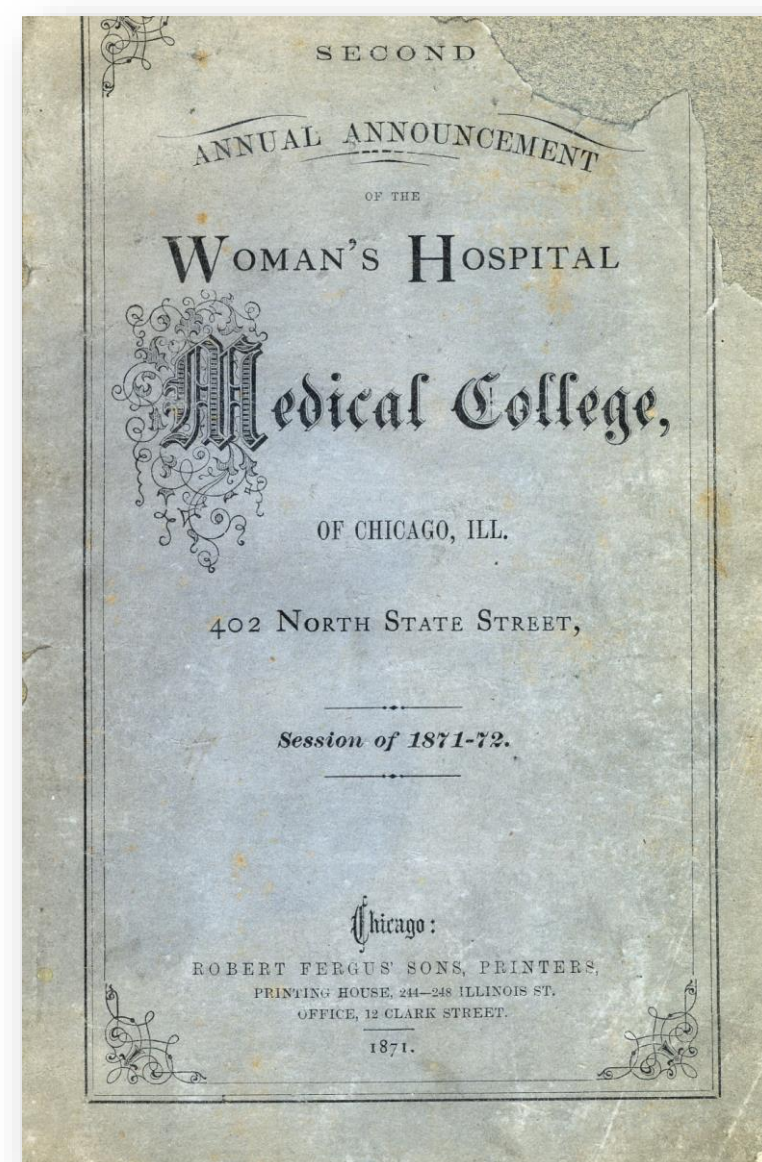
Woman's Medical College

337-339 S. Lincoln St.



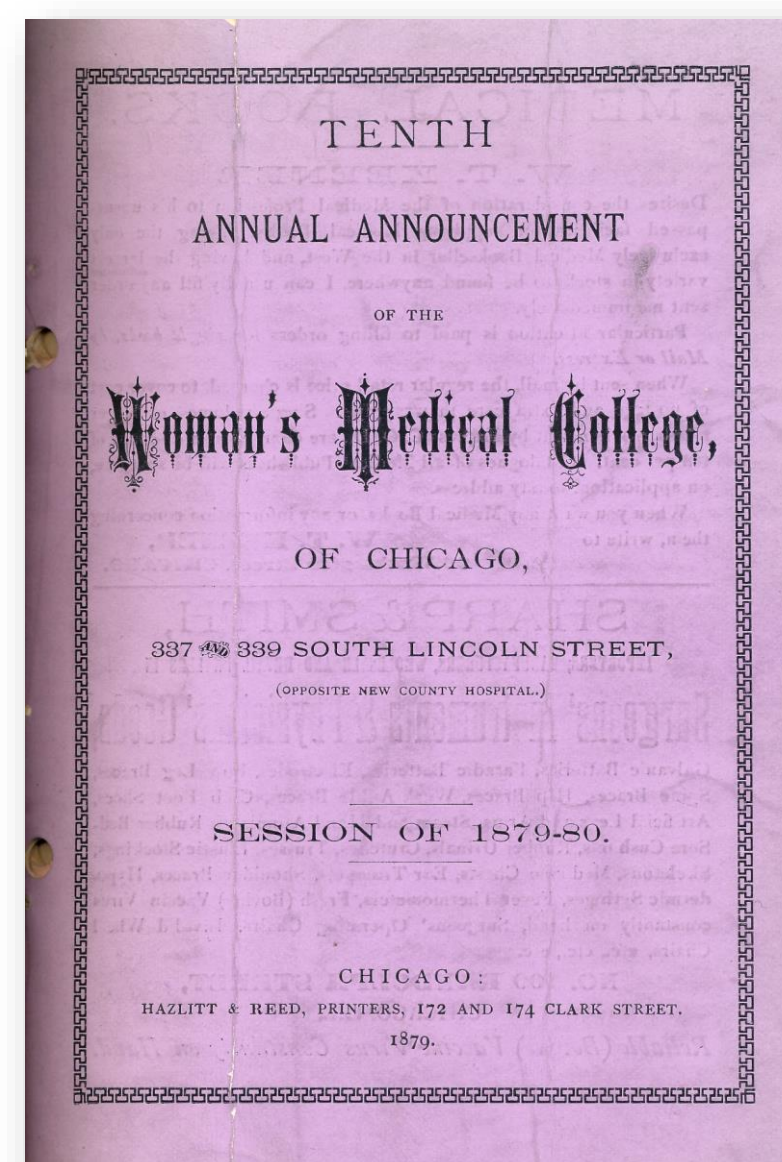
Chicago Hospital for Women and Children, founded 1865

Structure built in 1885 at 1712 W. Adams St.



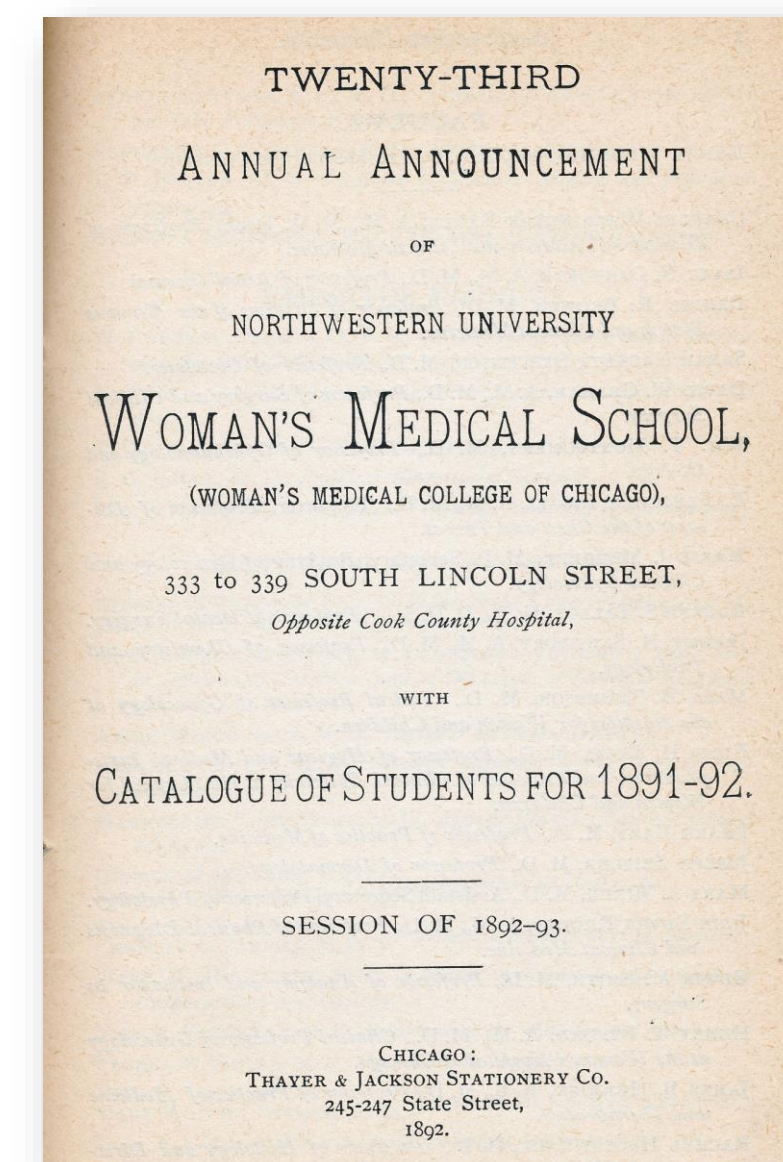
Northwestern University
